MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD VIRTUALLY ON
6TH AUGUST AT 7.15 P.M.

1. Welcome and to consider accepting apologies for absence

The Chairman, Cllr Warwick, welcomed those present to the meeting. There were no apologies for absence.

2. To receive signed declaration of acceptance of office from Mr David Kemble

Cllr Kemble signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office form and was given 2 copies of the Disclosable Pecuniary Interests and Other Registrable Interests form.

3. To declare any Interests re items on the agenda

There were no Interests declared.

4. To confirm minutes of the meeting held on January 2nd 2020

The minutes had been circulated. Cllr Knight proposed the minutes of January 2nd be accepted as a true and accurate record of the meeting, seconded by Cllr Warwick and carried.

5. To discuss any matters from the minutes of January (not on the agenda)

There were no matters arising.

6. To discuss any necessary Correspondence

The Clerk received an email from Scarning Parish Council enquiring whether Wendling P.C. would be interested in joining a Community Speed Watch Scheme to try to combat the speeding problem. The Scheme can only be operated on roads where the speed is under 40 m.p.h. In Wendling the speed limit is 50 m.p.h. apart from a short distance down Station Road where it is 30 m.p.h. Eventually there will be a reduction in speed to 40 m.p.h. The Clerk will inform Scarning P.C. that when the 40 m.p.h. is in place Wendling P.C. will be able to become involved and use the Community Speed Watch equipment.

8. To discuss Highways Matters

Highways matters were discussed under item 6. Resurfacing had been carried out but the hot weather had caused the surfaces to break up a bit. All the 'gritty stuff' from the resurfacing was left behind by Highways and it was felt this was unacceptable, so the Chairman will be sending an email to Highways about this. On the footpath down Station Road there is a lot of overhanging foliage, so the property owner will be spoken to about this.
